








History of Buffalo Quarry

- 1. Has been inactive since about 1985.
- 2. After the quarry went inactive it filled with water and became a prime habitat for the gray bat.
- Population discovered by National Weather Service Radar in Springfield, Missouri
- 4. Liberty purchased Buffalo Quarry in December of 2019

Hibernaculum for Gray Bats, Tricolor Bats, and Big Brown Bats













Proposed Delisting

- On April 16th, 2025 USFWS provided the 5-year review of the Gray Bat Endangered Species Listing.
- The report specifically calls out the preservation of maternity colonies as one
 of the reasons the Service is purposing the delisting of the species.
- Empire has been implementing a 10(a)1(a) research permit since 2021.
 - Data gathered on Gray bat interactions with wind turbines hadn't been studied in the past.
 - The data gather has been used by USFWS as another data point in the decision to purpose the delisting.
